# Science Challenge

## <u>Go on a Tree Hunt.</u>



Take a little bag and a magnifying glass if you have one. When you find a new tree, try to find one of its leaves on the ground. What shape is it? Are the edges rounded, frilly or spikey? Are the leaves bigger or smaller than the next tree you find. Put the leaves in your bag to take home. You might want to sketch the tree. Which direction do the branches grow? Does the tree have any flowers or fruit on them?

Trees are either evergreen or deciduous. Can you find out what these words mean? Are the trees you found evergreen or deciduous?

Below is what we would have been doing in Maths and English this week. It would be great if you wanted to have a go at them.

## Maths

This week we have revisited some of our previous learning, so I would like you to think about the following:

Measuring Length and Height

### Length

Can you find three toys and order them from shortest to tallest? Can you use nonstandard units (objects that are the **same** size) to measure the toys e.g. building block, bricks, hands etc

Find things around your home that are shorter than you?

Find things around you home that are taller than 1 metre. Remember 1 metre is 100cm. Someone at home may have a tape measure in a sewing kit or DIY kit.





If you have a ruler at home can you draw some lines e.g 9cm and ask someone in your family to measure them using the ruler. Can they measure them correctly? Remember the Ocm must be at one end of the line/object.

Can you measure the height of the plant you have been studying?

### Weight

Can you find 3 objects around you home that are of different weights? To decide which is heavier, put one in each hand and make a best guess or use some measuring scales if you have any.

Ask a grown up if you can do some baking.

Use scales to measure the ingredients in grams.

Challenge – can you write out the recipe but **double** all the ingredients to make a bigger cake/more cookies etc.
