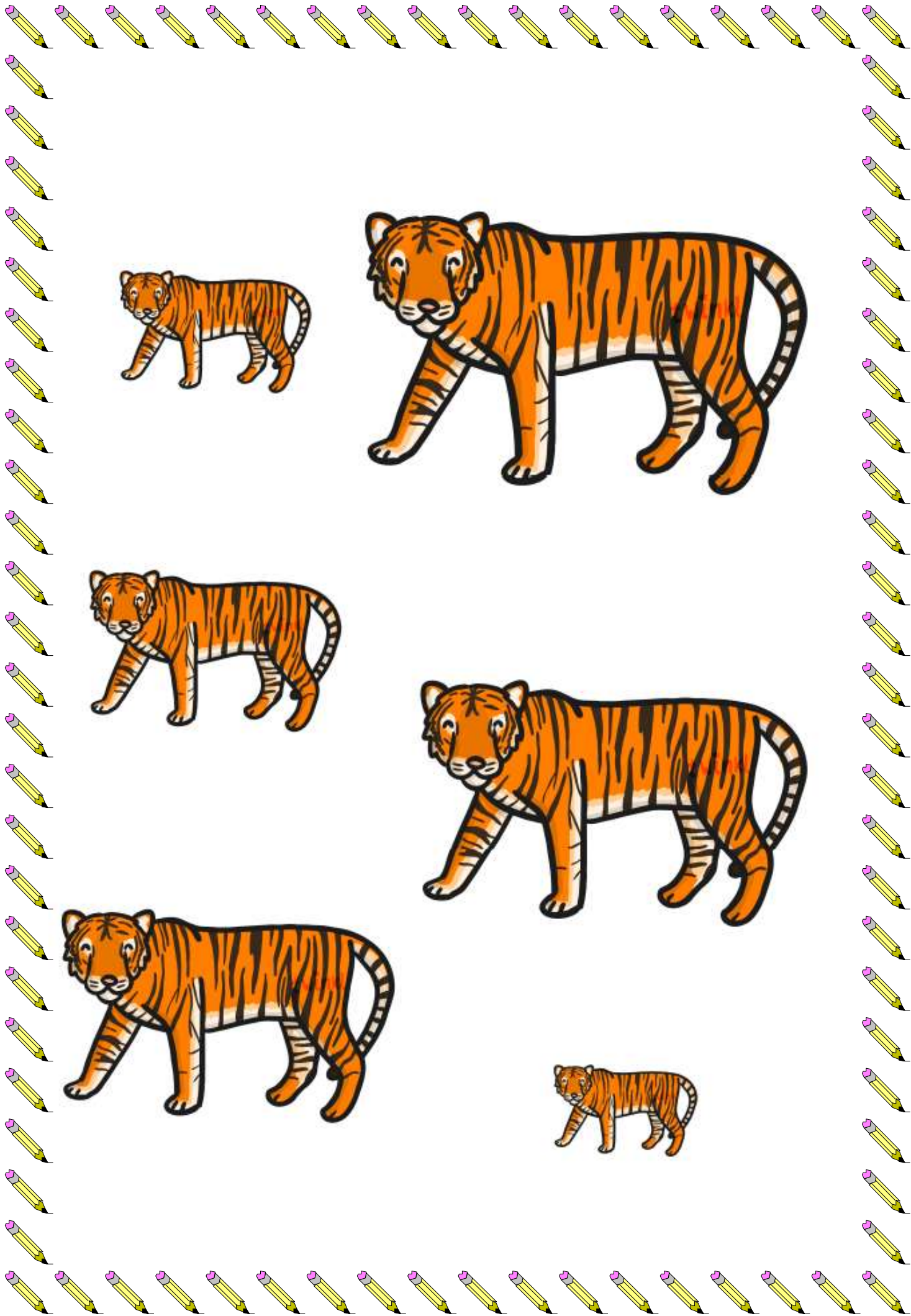
- Read/listen to 'Rumble in the Jungle'. Can you draw the characters from the story and carefully cut them out. Can you retell the story using your characters?
- In the story 'Rumble in the Jungle' there are lots of rhyming words. Can you listen and look to find the rhyming words in the book. Write a list of the rhyming words you find.
- Can you make a pair of binoculars? You could practise our sound 'ee ee what can you see?' and imagine you are in a jungle. Play the memory game with an adult or sibling and see how many you can remember. E.g. I can see a parrot. (next person) I can see a parrot and a tiger etc.
- Rainforest/Jungle size ordering. Can you carefully cut the tigers out and put them in size order from smallest to biggest. If you are unable to print, find objects from around your home and put them in size order.
- In a rainforest the weather can change quickly. Can you make a weather diary for the week? Each day write down if it is sunny, rainy, cloudy etc and draw a small picture to show the weather - just like our weather charts we have in class.
- I Spy challenge - can you carefully count the jungle animals?
