Can you draw or paint your favourite animal and label the different features? E.g legs, wings, eyes. (Challenge: Can you write a sentence/ some sentences about your favourite animal? Remember to use your sounds and leave a finger space between each word)	AOL: Literacy, Understanding the world, Expressive Arts and Design L- Hears and says the initial sound in words.
