



WHAT'S COOKING?

Jasmine's Vanilla Shortbread Star Biscuit Recipe

Jasmine chose this recipe as it is her favorite biscuit!

INGREDIENTS


- 150g plain flour
- 100g butter
- 50g vanilla sugar

FOR THE VANILLA SUGAR

- 1 vanilla pod
- 225g caster sugar

METHOD

- To make the vanilla sugar, whizz the vanilla pod and sugar in a blender. Pour through a sieve and blend again. Store in an airtight jar.
- Preheat the oven to Gas Mark 4, 180°C, fan 160°C. Place the flour and butter in a bowl and rub together to form crumbs. Add the vanilla sugar and mix to form a dough. Roll out the dough. Using a star-shaped cutter, cut out stars and place on a baking tray lined with nonstick baking paper.





Dust with icing and serve!

Milky bar slices by Olivia

Ingredients:

300g icing sugar

150g shortbread biscuits crushed

250g butter melted

275g white chocolate spread

100g milk chocolate

300g milky bar chocolate

Milky bar buttons to decorate

Method:

- 1) Mix together the icing sugar and crushed biscuits
- 2) Mix the melted butter and chocolate spread in a separate bowl
- 3) Pour the wet mixture into the dry ingredients
- 4) Squash mixture into a lined and greased baking tin
- 5) Melt the milky bar white chocolate over a bowl of boiling water
- 6) Pour the melted white chocolate on top of the base
- 7) Melt the milk the chocolate the same way then drizzle over the white chocolate and add the toppings
- 8) Put in the fridge to set. At least 1 hour but the longer the better.



Banana bread step by step by Oliver Year 6

- 100g softened butter 175g caster sugar 2 large eggs 2 ripe bananas (mashed) 225g self-raising flour
- 1tsp backing powder
- 2tsp milk

- I put 100g of softened butter on a weighing scale Then I put it in a bowl
- Next, I weighed 175g of caster sugar
- And put that in a bowl
- After I cracked to eggs in the bowl
- Then I mashed up 2 ripe bananas Then put that in the bowl

- Followed with 2tsp of milk Then I stirred all that together
- I greased the loaf tin
- After I poured the cake mix in the tin
- After it has been cocked
- Then your decoration (optional)
- After that you can eat it







225g self raising flour Pinch of salt

55g chilled butter 120g mature grated cheddar

90-100ml milk

Heat the oven to 200C/180C.

Sift the flour into a bowl then add the salt, cayenne pepper and baking powder then sift all together to make sure its fully combined.

Sprinkle in the grated cheese and mix with hands. After, cut the butter into cubes and add it to the mixture, then mix it with you

Next, make a hole in the middle of the mixture then add the milk in little by little and then mix with hands until you get a dough like consistency.

Lightly flour a surface and roll out you dough to roughly 2cm. Cut them out using a [medium] cutter. Put them on a sheet of greaseproof paper and then on a baking

Next, glaze them with a bit of milk and then sprinkle the grated cheese on top.

Finally, bake then for 15-20 mins until golden brown and cooked through.

On the 22nd April it was Earth Day. This year's theme was Climate Change.


This means that human action is making the earth get hotter which has a huge impact on the world. It is melting the ice at the poles which will lead to rising water levels.

"Thanks." I replied sarcastically.



A Short Story by Sophie






