A noun tells us what someone or something is called. A noun can be the name of a living thing, an object, a place or an emotion. Here are some examples:

Living things	Objects	Places	Emotions
dog, cat, plant,	car, cup, chair,	kitchen, park,	love, jealousy,
human, Sally, he,	bed, book,	London, field,	anger, trust,
she, I, you, they	aeroplane, bread	America	passion

Common nouns

All the things we can see, hear, touch, smell, taste or feel are common nouns.


For example:
