When we read we often make decisions about what we think is most likely to be true based on the information given in the text. This is called inferring.

Read the narrative.

Bindiyup Rock

Reece looked around and picked up the sleeping bags and put them in the car, making his dad stop what he was doing and stare at him.

- While the adults were setting up the tents and lighting the barbecue, Reece and Josh were itching to explore the bush around them. Every time they disappeared, one of their mums would yell at them to come back and do something. In the end, the mums gave in. Reece's mum told the boys to take Ellie for a walk around the base of the rock while they organised dinner.
- 7. The boys whooped with excitement, grabbed one of Ellie's hands each and headed towards the rock. They studied it as they walked but had to stop every few minutes so Ellie could show them some 'interesting' stone or weed she had discovered. Eventually, Reece found a spot in the rock they could climb up. The boys told Ellie to wait exactly where she was and that they would only be a few minutes.
- About fifteen minutes later, the boys jumped down from a small ledge on the rock, laughing and shouting. Josh did a big 'Tarzan' roar, making Reece laugh even harder. All of a sudden, Reece's smile disappeared. He went pale and his stomach flipped over inside him. Ellie was gone! The boys yelled out her name over and over and decided to backtrack to the campsite.
- When they arrived back, there were other people at the campgrounds. Reece pushed past them looking for his mum and found Ellie sitting on her lap with red eyes and a frown.
- 'She'd made it all the way to the lake, Reece', his Dad said in a quiet but serious tone Reece had never heard before. 'We are so lucky they found her in time.'
- Just as Reece noticed the new people were wearing life jackets, Ellie started whimpering that she wanted to go home.

- (c) He may have been surprised that Reece was out of bed. This could be the best answer, but
- (d) As Reece was putting the sleeping bags in the car when Dad stopped and stared, he was probably surprised that his son was helping without being asked. This is the best answer.
- 2. How do you think Reece was feeling during the trip to Bindiyup Rock?
 - (a) Carsick.
 - (b) Bored and happy.
 - (c) Bored and annoyed.
 - (d) Annoyed and tired.

Choosing the best answer

- (a) Nowhere in the text does it suggest that Reece was carsick. This is not the best answer.
- (b) He was bored as there was not much to see, but the text does not suggest he was happy. This is not the right answer.
- (c) He was bored as there wasn't much to see and he was probably annoyed as Ellie had put a sweet in his hair. This is probably the best answer, but check all answers.
- (d) He was annoyed, but the text does not suggest he was tired at all. This is not the best answer.
