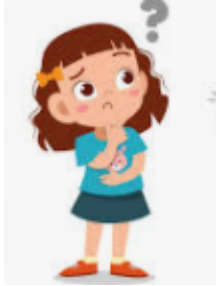


Year 1, Week 6, Science.

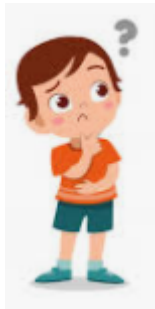
Question

Can you tell your grown up what a carnivore eats, a herbivore eats and an omnivore eats?

A gorilla is a **mammal**, but is it a **carnivore**, a **herbivore** or an **omnivore**?



A gorilla eats plants, so it is a **herbivore**!

Challenge.
