Question

What did you learn last week in history?



You were learning about chronology and your family.

You will need:

The timeline of your family.

The answers to the questions you asked your eldest family member or your grown up.



You were a historic detective last week and it is time to look at your discoveries and record the information like a real detective!

Let's start.

The questions you asked your family members were.

What toys did they play with when they were 5 years old?

What did they do at school when they were 5 years old?

Now, can you answer the same questions?

Amazing!



Are your answers the same or different from your family member?

Do you play with the same toys?

Do you do the same things at school?

This is tricky, but can you find anything that is the same?

Can you find anything that is different? Tell your grown up.



Do you have any more notelets? If not cut out some squares of paper.

On these notelets, write the questions you asked your family member and their answers. These can now be put underneath your family members name on the timeline.

Do the same for your questions and answers.

Now you have evidence of historical events!

Your family member's answers are probably different to yours but there could also be similarities, or things that are the same.

### Challenge.

Think of some more questions to ask your family member or grown up. This is how you learn to investigate and form questions. Write your answers down and you can keep a record of what happened in the past and what happens today.
