

Children's Commission - Managing Children's Digital Lives

The Children's Commission has launched a guide for parents and carers about managing children's digital lives. The guide provides advice and support for navigating the online world with your child.

The guide covers a range of topics from the Online Safety Act, Artificial Intelligence, managing screen time and how to stay safe on the internet. The guide contains the opinion of children on each topic that is discussed. The Children's Commission have also created a version for children that includes an activity pack

The guide also provides conversation starters to help you discuss concerns and to learn more about how your child interacts with the internet.
