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Foundation Stage Learning

We have been celebrating and learning about Diwali. Miss Modasia visited us and talked about how she celebrates Diwali. She told us the story of Rama and Sita and explained what happen on each day during this festival. We talked about the similarities and differences between Diwali and Christmas.

Year 2 Learning

We have been on a trip to the forest, where we collected lots of 'rubbish' to help us build a 100-decker rocket! We managed to build super rockets that were even taller than some of the children! We have also been learning about the gunpowder plot, coasts and Judaism, as well as continuing with our amazing writing and maths!

Year 4 Learning

Year 4 have been enjoying their cricket! We've been lucky enough to have our amazing coach teaching us the skills we need to play the sport and it's getting us all active too. Recently, we started learning about Roman chariots, invaders and their history. We can't wait for our 'Portals To The Past' visitors to learn even more about these intuitive, intelligent and sometimes brutal people!

Nursery Learning

We started the new term with a fantastic bonfire in the forest to celebrate Bonfire night, making smores with Mrs Mann and exploring the woodland and trees. We have a very busy few weeks ahead of us, starting with us celebrating Diwali next week.

Vear 1 Learning

Wow! What an exciting start to the term we have had. This week we went on an adventure to explore a mysterious space crash. Beegu the alien has come to visit this term and we can't wait to write her story and help her return home!

Year 3 Learning

Surprisingly, Year 3 had a visit from a cheeky, and very messy woolly mammoth. The classrooms were covered in mud and leaves and the mammoth was dirty too. As a result of this, we are learning to write instructions for how to wash a woolly mammoth!

Year 5 Learning

In Year 5, we have been continuing with our Intergalactic Invaders topic by exploring our new class reader, 'The Space We're In' and using 'How to be an Astronaut' as a stem for our descriptive diary writing, as we imagine ourselves on the International Space Station (ISS). We have also enjoyed taking home the 'Let's Do Science' telescopes to explore the night sky and stargaze.

Year 6 Learning

In Year 6, our Call of the Wild topic continues, and we have been finding out all about cheetahs. We have been discovering their special adaptations and are working towards creating our own double-page spread all about these fascinating felines. Next week, we can't wait to use plaster gauze to create 3D cheetah masks which we will paint and make look as realistic as possible. In the coming weeks, we will be diving further into the world of science when we study the topic of evolution and inheritance. We can't wait to carry out our 'best beak' investigation and read the fantastic book 'Moth' to help us understand this tricky area.
