We have had a fantastic start to the new school year at nursery. Exploring all our new resources has definitely been number one on everyone's list! Foundation Stage Learning

The FS children have had a great start to the year! They have made lots of new friends and have particularly enjoyed exploring and playing outside. The children are learning the class rules and routines and are looking forward to the exciting activities planned for this term.

Year 1 Learning

Year 1 have had an absolutely amazing start to the year and we are super proud of them. We have begun the term finding out about Europe to help us design a Year 1 window feature for the glass corridor. We are getting really excited about beginning our Great Fire of London work and will be having some exciting visitors next week to launch our topic.

Year 2 Learning

We have been learning all about the continent of Australia this week and creating some aboriginal art which you will be able to see for yourself in the coming weeks. Year 3 have been researching where our class names, Eiffel and Colosseum are from. For a whole school art display our year group has been learning about Asia. We have found that Asia is an enormous continent with a wide range of countries. Languages, culture, animals, food are just a few of the areas we have explored. This term we are excited to immerse ourselves in our topic 'Yaba Daba Doo', which is all about the Stone Age to Iron Age.

Year 4 Learning

In year 4 we have been looking forward in our lives and preparing for the future. We shared ideas about things we would like to do in the future and what we aspire to be. As we move forward into year 4 we are very excited to start learning about Romans and about the Earth and the creatures within it. We have had a great start in year 5! This week has been very special for us as we have been celebrating all the cultures within our school. We have been learning all about south & central America. Year 6 Learning

Year 6 have kicked off the new term with 'A Race to the Sea: A Turtle's Tale': narrating the story of a plucky hatchling's perilous journey to the sanctuary of the sea and using watercolours to illustrate. We have also been creating Aboriginal art as part of understanding where Uluru and Barrier Reef classes fit geographically.








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Absence Matters and You Can Help
