Reminders about School Closure

Occasionally, it is necessary to close the school. This could be due to lack of heating, lack of water or severe weather which makes it impossible to make the site safe. In such a case, a text message will be sent out at the earliest possible time. We will also add information to our school website and Facebook so please keep checking this for further advice.

Please make sure children are sent to school in appropriate outdoor clothing during wintry weather. We do send the children out to play and a warm coat, gloves and a hat are advisable. Remember to make sure all items are labelled with your child's name so that they can be returned if lost.









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Attendance

Each school day has two sessions, which is why registers are taken twice a day. Ninety percent school attendance is equal to half a day of absence per week – over a year that adds up to four weeks of absence in an academic year. Over the course of a child's education, ninety percent attendance means they would be absent for one whole year of their education. Children who regularly miss school may fall behind in their work which can have an impact on their grades. They will also miss out on fun opportunities to learn new things and spend time with friends. Parents can also be assured that when children are in school, they are safe. Parents and carers are responsible for ensuring their children attend school.

Punctuality is also important as small amounts of time missed can add up and impacts pupils learning.

Term 1 whole-school attendance was 95.4%.

Remember: Good Punctuality Matters!

If a child misses 10 minutes per day, they will miss out on the following learning:

50 minutes per week
200 minutes per month (3 hours and 20 minutes)
650 minutes per term (10 hours 50 minutes)
1950 minutes per year (32 hours 30 minutes)
