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Nursery Learning

Little Ferns have had a great term. They have spent time in the forest going on a bear hunt! They didn't find the bear, but they did find the Three Little Bears hiding from Goldilocks! They have had lots of fun sizing teddy bears, big, medium and small. Little Ferns have had such a fun filled term learning about traditional stories!

Foundation Stage Learning

This term, FS have been finding out about the past. They have had enjoyed learning about dinosaurs and the different types of food that they ate. They had great fun digging and finding rocks in the sand outside. Then using special tools, they discovered small dinosaurs in the rocks! The children then wrote about what they had found!

Year 1 Learning

We have been learning about meteorologists and how they study the weather. We had great fun when we went outside to investigate the wind and the rain! We have also been enjoying the story 'The Journey' and have been writing our own alternative learning!

Year 2 Learning

Year 2 have discovered tiny fairies and elves who have set up home in our school and class. They even created a secret garden and we made our very own leaf elves and fairies. We also enjoyed the last of our drumming lessons and the Explorer Dome finding out about light!

Vear 3 Learning

We have had great fun learning about Ancient Egypt, we have learnt why the river Nile was so important. We became historians and looked at a range of artefacts to find out what we could learn the Egyptian people. In science, we explored which materials make the best shadows and developed our understanding of light.

Year 4 Learning

In year 4 we have been learning all about the digestive system. We did a brilliant activity which involved crackers, tights, some orange juice and a pair of scissors. It was a hands-on practical way of looking at and understanding what happens to our food as it moves through our bodies. The children absolutely loved it, even those who were apprehensive at the beginning. We're currently writing up our non-chronological report and these real-life experiences will enrich our writing.

Vear 5 Learning

It has been a busy few weeks for year 5, with visits from 'Skipping John' and the Explorer Dome, as well as immersing ourselves in our 'Terrific Tudor' topic. In science we have been working with different materials and carried out experiments to explore their properties. We are getting excited about our trip to Hampton Court next month and will come back with lots of news and experiences to share!

Year 6 Learning

We have had a magical term with our Harry Potter topic. We have been creating an evil Hogwart's teacher and have described Diagon alley. We have finished the term with our Harry Potter day where we have solved a maths potion challenge, made wands and been sorted into our houses.







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Safer Internet Day

We celebrated Safer Internet Day 2024 by doing some brilliant activities across the whole school. All the way from the EYFS up to year 6, there were activities focused on being safe on the web.

The internet is such a huge part of our pupils' lives and we want them to know it is positive to talk about things they find tricky whilst exploring it. That's why we took time to highlight who the safe adults are at Ferndale and who they can go to with concerns.

Our KS2 assembly, ran by Mr P-B, explored the history of technology and what happens when things change. Our KS1 assembly used a story and song to help children know of some of situations that they might face and how they could deal with them.

It was great to go around and see some of the amazing activities happening in different year groups. Year 4 discussed influencers and the positive or negative impacts they can have on our lives. In year 1, the children learned what to do with unwanted messages and pop-ups. Year 5 were talking about developments in AI and year 6 created their own influencers!

Posters created by children in each year group will be displayed around the school to help educate and inform others about Internet safety. Guiding our learners to be safe on the internet is vital in today's world. Thanks for everyone who took part.









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UK Safer Internet Centre – How to set up filters on you home internet

How to set up filters on your home internet to help prevent age-inappropriate content being accessed on devices in your home.

The 4 big internet providers in the UK – BT, Sky, TalkTalk and Virgin Media – provide their customers with free parental controls which can be activated at any time. They have come together to produce these helpful video guides to help you to download and set-up the controls offered by your provider. We know that children, particularly younger children, can be bothered by things they see online, and filters can be a helpful tool in reducing the chances of coming across something upsetting. A massive well done to our Young Voices choir who sang beautifully when we attended the Young Voices concert in January. They performed alongside approximately 5,000 children making them one of the largest choirs in the world.











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World Religion Day

To celebrate World Religion Day, we had a RE day around the theme of 'Light'. We thought about how light can make people feel better and that different colours of light can create different responses, feelings and thoughts. We thought about what light can mean to different religions and how it is used in religious celebrations.

FS learnt about how light is used to celebrate Chinese New Year and made Chinese lanterns.

Year 1 made paper Christingles and discussed what the different parts represent to Christians.

Year 2 worked in groups to make paper Menorahs and learnt about the Jewish festival of Hanukah.

Year 3 explored the importance of light and diva lamps to celebrate Diwali and their use in Hindu Shrines. They thought about light and how candles can be used to support prayer. After this, they created their own stained-glass windows with symbols of light in the middle of them.

Year 4 decorated and made candle holders to celebrate the winter solstice.

Year 5 learnt about different candles including Islamic candles and Baptist candles. Then they designed and decorated their own candles.

Year 6 identified positive words and emotions linked to light. They discussed Human Light celebration.


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World Book Day

Love from us all, and huge, thanks!










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Attendance
